- As debris went flying across the complex, carefully check your carport for screws.
- We are asking that each resident clean their own carport areas and a neighbor's if they are unable to. Brooms are available in the trash room. After Helene, 4 residents cleaned the property and all 56 carports. We **all** share responsibility in maintaining Quincy property, especially in emergency situations.
- Please stay away from **all areas** marked with caution tape. If you park in damaged carport areas it is at your own risk. There is caution tape also by the north tree because broken tree branches are dangling and may fall at any time.
- The grill is currently non-operational. A fountain timer needs to be replaced.
- Many exit signs are down. We will use existing supplies to repair those we can and order additional ones.
- The relocation of part of the island is being assessed to determine action.
- Trees and shrubbery have been uprooted. We will work with Vesta to determine who is responsible for which trees.
- Board members are assessing our emergency procedures and will update them. If you have any suggestions, please put them in the board box.
- As we have asked repeatedly, **BREAK DOWN YOUR BOXES**. Dumpster space is an issue on a regular basis but more so now.
